School Description and Mission Statement

West Portal School is a Kindergarten through 5th grade school of over 550 students. The primary purpose of West Portal School is learning. This perspective is consistently supported by the students, the staff and the parent community. Our vision and mission statements reflect the belief in some very basic premises: 1) All students can learn and succeed, 2) Success breeds success, 3) Schools control the conditions of success within the school environment, and 4) Collaboration amongst all the stakeholders is essential.

School Instruction and Leadership

West Portal consists of a General Education program strand that presently includes 16 classrooms and a Chinese Immersion program strand that includes 8 classrooms. We have several demonstration classrooms that have met selected criteria in the areas of classroom environment, project-based instruction, language-rich climate, and adult support for students. The General Education program is known for its developmentally appropriate practices, and for the ability of teachers to incorporate science, cultural, and artistic enrichment into the curriculum. Our Chinese two-way language immersion alternative program has provided a Cantonese bilingual and cultural education at West Portal since 1984.

Opportunities for Parental Involvement

Parents and guardians play a vital role in the school. They volunteer in the classroom and at home, come on field trips, work in the library, plan class festivities, share in decision-making, support the instructional program, and serve as curriculum resources. They started our noontime game room, organize Exploratorium science nights at West Portal and after school activities, coordinate our annual participation in the Chinese New Year Parade, and provide other support for our children. All parents and guardians are invited to join the West Portal Parents Club, and participate in the fund-raising programs that provide instructional materials as well as enrichment activities. Parents and guardians are our most valuable resource.

School Facility Conditions & Improvements

West Portal is presently being under construction through the 2003 Prop A Bond. Ramps, bathrooms, entry ways, stairwells, classroom sinks and bathrooms, kitchen, elevator and fire alarm system have been either upgraded or replaced in order to comply with the State's ADA compliances. Much of the work has been completed and the remaining is in the process of completion. After this work is completed, the outdoor yards will be worked on in order to comply with ADA accessibility. Also, certain outdoor areas on campus will be greened and transformed into outdoor learning areas through funds connected with Prop A.

School Safety Plan

The children, staff and parents at West Portal School are aware of the school's Safety plan. Principal and staff form the Crisis Response Team and develop a Safe School Plan to prepare for emergencies, which will be reviewed, by parents, teachers and students each year. Staff, students and parents participate in fire drills once a month and earthquake and emergency drills twice a year. Staff is provided the latest info. directives from the district regarding safety and health issues. Child abuse prevention and reporting procedures are disclosed for staff at faculty meetings. Staff receives updates in CPR/first aid and emergency training. Weekly home-school communication folders convey messages to parents about traffic safety and safe school information.

Types of Services Funded

West Portal provides an after school tutoring program for are targeted at risk students. This year this is being provide though Discretionary Block Grant funds.

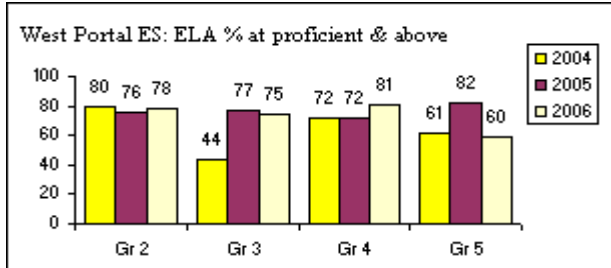
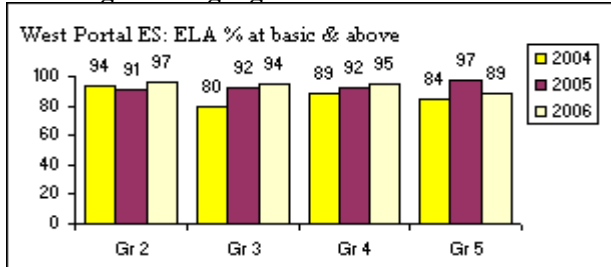

CAT6 - 3 Year Trend

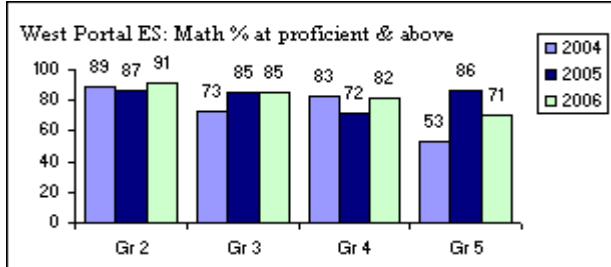
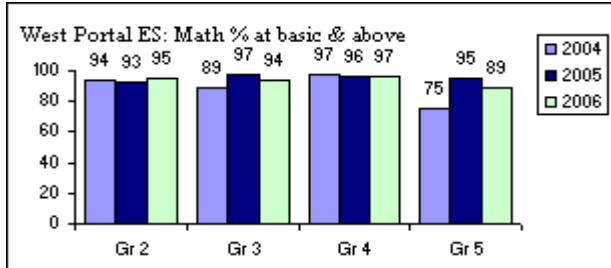
